November Elections

Election Day is Tuesday, November 8th and your voice needs to be heard. Voting is now more accessible to everyone and your local county voter registration office can help. You may apply in advance for an absentee ballot or take part in advanced voting. Registered voters may apply for an absentee ballot in order to cast their ballot when voting at the polling place is not an option. Advance voting allows registered voters to cast their ballot at the county voter registration office during the week prior to Election Day.
