Thirty-five scary tales about interaction between the living and the dead, selected from the period when fiction about the supernatural flourished with the help of small magazines. Many stories are by well known authors, such as Henry James, Charles Dickens, Rudyard Kipling, Arthur Conan Doyle, and R.L. Stevenson. Several are set in haunted houses around the holidays.
