National Parks Senior Pass

The Senior Pass is a low-cost lifetime national park pass that gives senior citizens free access to U.S. national parks, forests, refuges, monuments, and recreation areas. U.S. citizens or permanent residents at least 62 years old may purchase one for a one-time processing fee for \$10.00. The Senior Pass allows the holder and three adults free admittance. The Access Pass is a special permit for people of any age who are blind or have other permanent disabilities. It offers the same benefits as the Senior Pass free of charge.
